

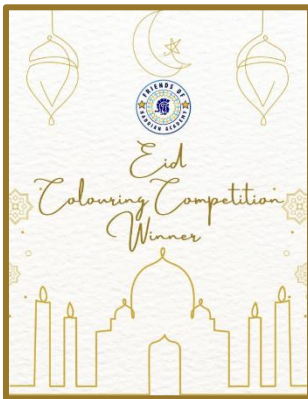

### Year 3 Chiltern Open Air Museum

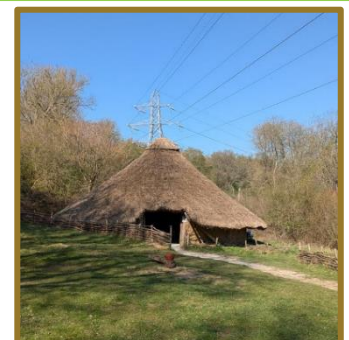
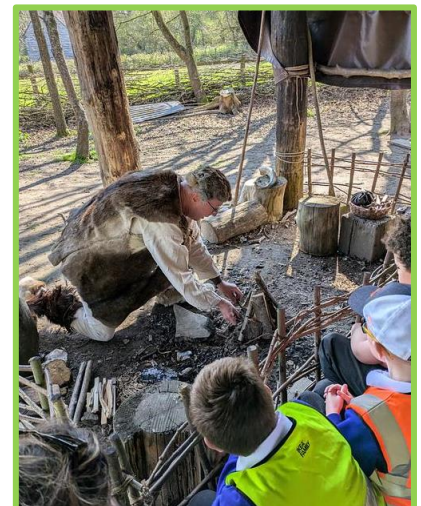

A big thank you to all of our parent helpers who helped it be a brilliant day!

Their Easter performance was equally impressive, showcasing their hard work and creativity—well done to all involved!

Yesterday, we all went to the Chiltern Open Air Museum. We had lots of fun doing different things like making butter, clay pots (which we got to keep!) and inside the roundhouse we ground flour to make flatbreads and then we visited the Stone Age section. The man was wearing animal skin and then he told us to follow him. He taught us to hunt animals and throw spears. I was quite good in my group! 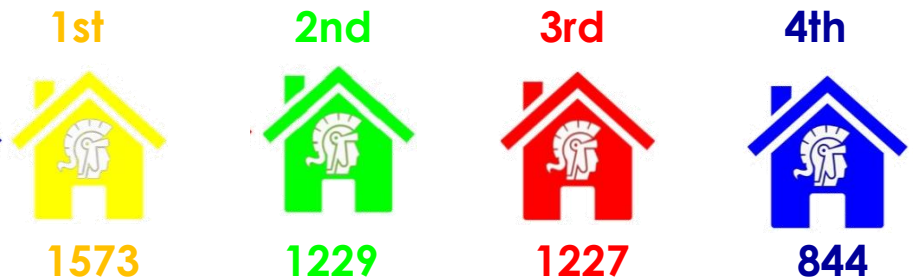

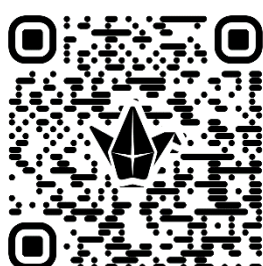
