SNAP Parent Carer Forum have arranged a series of SEND Roadshows for this academic year. The first event is next month in Dunstable. Our Roadshows bring together services which support children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities and their families, all in one place. We have various stall holders which include representatives from health, local authority, social care and voluntary sector services. They are family friendly events held in an accessible venue throughout the county.

These are in person events for parents and carers of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities. Their child does not need a diagnosis for families to come and get help at a roadshow. They may:

- be new to SEND and unsure what help is available
- feel their child needs help or have questions about the support they already receive
- want to find out what support there is for the family
- not be sure what support they might need

Our First event is in Dunstable at the Priory Church Hall (LU5 4RU), 7th November 10am-12pm. Please note local parking is pay and display. This is free event and there is no need to book in advance. Free copies of our book Supporting Your Neurodiverse Child/Young Person will be available while stocks last.
